Everyone? Even my mom? *Me*: Yep. *Kid* 2: My dad? *Me*: Yep. *Kid* 1: ... you? *Me*: Yep. (all the kids laugh hysterically) *Kid* 1: ... so you can hear and smell farts? *Me*: Some of the farts yes. Not all of them. *Kid* 2: Can hearing people see farts? *Kid* 3: Yeah. Green smoke comes out of their butt, I saw it on TV. *Me*: That doesn't happen in real life. *Kid* 1: What?! Ugh. I don't understand farts. (later) I went to college for 8 years to have these conversations.



SSI AGM 2023

From November 30th to December 1st, 2023 the Annual General Meeting for the Sahtu Secretiat Incorporated had happened in Tulita, NT. Everyone from other communities such as Norman Wells, Deline, Fort Good Hope, and Colville Lake had come in to talk and greet everyone involved as well as their families and friends. Each Land Corporation presented their audited financial statements, their notes, and their greetings to the beneficiary members and the people they had invited to the meeting such as the



Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada and the Regional Health, who also gave their presentations about Addictions and Mental Health. The Tulita Land Corporation had helped by managing meals and rentals, such as vehicles, places to stay, and events to keep the people entertained. There were talent shows, drum dances, bingos, and raffles for people to win prizes and gifts.

Many words were said during the meetings, such the opening words from SSI Chairperson, Charles McNeely, Host community Tulita Land Corp President David Menacho and Fort Norman Metis President Lindsay Norwegian. The newly elected MLA Danny McNeely was able to make a presentation by Zoom to the SSI AGM. He apologized for not being able to attend but was able list his priorities, Swearing in, and presentations of Premiers for next week. Many have asked McNeely about his priorities and his promises of working towards education, medical travel, housing, cost of living, and addictions towards drugs and

alcohol. Many responded hoping that education would be funded, especially for those who want to be pilots but SFA had denied. As well as for drug and alcohol preventation where presentations and posters be put up because the people are sick of being *reactors*. Which meant that the people would only react when something had already happened, like someone got hurt, react. Someone's kids got taken away, react. *We need to prevent, not react*. The



youth is our biggest priority and need to help their education so it would help them focus on themselves and their identity and hopefully take over for us in the future. We want to make them proud of our history, all the work we have done, and continue the work to help future generations. To do this, we need to open ways for funding towards school, courses, programs, and conferences. Medical Travel was another big issue that

was discussed. Getting to appointments were hard, getting medical equipment was hard, such as oxygen tanks, and detoxing. It should be said to everyone that when someone tries to get help and goes to treatment, they should not be judged. It takes a lot to make that decision and when they come back and if they ever fall off the wagon, please do not judge. It may take a few times for treatment to stick. Help them by offering coffee/tea at your/their home and listen to them. Sometimes it



takes a good conversation to help stay with their treatment. Other issues that came up as well was dental help, housing help for elders and those with disabilities, and getting the younger generations on the land and learning about their history from the elders. Getting Indigenous workers in our communities and not from the south, who often go through culture shock and isolation. There is open jobs for dental and mental health but it is hard to find the people and keep them, especially those who are from the NT. We need a treatment center in the NT, maybe on the land healing, and someone to help those who get overwhelmed when it comes to looking for help, especially when they do not understand which department and which application to work on. After these discussions, audits were talked about with the SSI which was about their



finance and what fundings they put it towards, which land corporation got what, and what they invested in. Audits were done for every land corporation, which means that everyone is looked over, all the recipts, visa statements, staff/venders pay, and how the money is managed. Everything is visible to the auditors and shown at the AGMs so that everyone understands how the money is

used and funded. If you would want to see it, check the reports and audits of previous years or call your land corp for information. Another issue was brought up on the last day. A letter of criticism was written to the Prime Minister and towards SSI on the wrongs that they perceived. How the SSI does not help or listen to them, but it was noted from the land corps that they should have called or contacted them instead to answer their questions or concerns. Such negative criticism is not needed, especially when it is written on social media where friends and family can see and feel the hurt as well as the workers who try their best to

help their people. Instead of spreading negativity and teaching the youth to stay away from future jobs for fear of this type of criticism, learn to communicate positively by calling the SSI and your land corps on information needed and how to access applications and information.



WINTER ROAD TIPS

Don't forget that this winter, we will have extra traffic from big trucks bringing in materials, food, and large items to the smaller communities of the North that are connected by the winter road. This means that the road will diminish faster than normal and the road conditions will depend on the weather, overflows, and accidents. Please be safe by having a LADD 1 radio in your





vehicle, a safety box or container of emergency winter supplies, and to notify family and friends when you left or arrived in a new area. With the decrease on the number of barges that came in during the summer 2023 due to low water levels and the extreme fire season, a lot of vehicles are going to be on the winter road. Even the residents of the North will be driving down south for

their grocery haul to make up for the lack of foods in the small communities. Make sure

that you make plans as well ahead of time before the road deteriorates over the winter season. Barges will come in less, it is not guaranteed, so please make sure you get your grocery haul in the south. Partner with friends who have vehicles and plan ahead to get your food and items.







Old Photos of Fort Norman






