The camp at Four Mile is where we set marten traps, used chainsaws to harvest wood, skinned



rabbits, and heard stories of the past. We also set hooks for loche on the river, and enjoyed some tasty fresh fish. The students gained a wealth of knowledge



from their Elders. Everyone had an amazing time and we are very thankful for all we learned. Mahsi cho to Robert Horassi, Ricky Andrew and the students.

Tulita Land Corporation Annual General Meeting

The AGM for the TLC was on December 9th and the 10th, 2023 at the Arena at 1pm. When it started, there was some concern about the correct way names were spelled and a sentence that did not make sense. The first in the agenda was the audits of the Tulita Land Corp, the Tulita Financial



Corp, and MacKay Range. The Auditor Aaron Halladeen, Legal Counsel Ceildh Stubbs, Brian Davidson were in attendance. There was a lot of discussions and questions about the contributions, professional fees, and a need for more information on the audits for the TLC. The audits that were represented at the AGM is a summary of all the paperwork that was gathered, which takes a lot of time

and effort from the auditors, the staff, and businesses. It would be hard to get audits much quicker because it relies on other businesses sending their reports and receipts to TLC, TFC, and MRDC. Sometimes these other businesses are unable to send because of their priorities and thus, makes it take longer for audits. There was questions about the amount of money in the bank but it was to account for funding given by the government or other organizations, which means that there are certain money for certain fundings and cannot be for others. Next was the TFC audit report.

Lorraine had explained how the SSI audits and AGM were late due to problems with accountants and the fires. The TFC audits had a dramatic decrease due to SSI investments in the past year, which could be due to the wars in Europe, Covid, and the inflation of prices on food and gas. This was the reason why certain programs were cut for 2023, like the elders pay, child pay, and scholarships. Also, a side note, the elders pay was only suppose to be a one time payment because

of the land claim agreement and was continued out of generosity. There were questions about the Covid funding and certain areas of the audit report. It was explained how it went towards food security,



POs, giftcards, Tulita resident's bills paid, and how it came in late but enough to help the community. Chief Frank Andrew helped explained where the money comes from and that if SSI and the Sahtu Trust does not do good, we don't as well. There were questions about money being moved around and money owed from TFC and MRDC. This is like loans and it is



always paid back because it helps to ensure payments from the government and other companies. They went over Housing Programs, which was money towards the community residents on fixing their homes and money towards purchasing land to put houses on. This would help residents towards purchasing it and owning their own homes as well. There were questions about Canol Outfitters, which was explained that the TFC had a share on it and so when it was sold, we would get a percentage of and it hopefully goes towards programs and events for the community of Tulita. But we at first need to help the TFC to build up their assets again so that it would not rely too much on the Sahtu Trust's investments. To help with this, there was a decision made for the staff to be moved over to TLC and to look for more funding for more programs in the future. Chief Frank Andrew explained again how the money that the Sahtu Trust is always there but sometimes you cannot rely on it. He brought up a story about how during the 9/11 that happened in the United





States affected us by 10 million dollars and that was in a different country. It depends on the economy of other countries like the war with Russia-Ukrainian and Israeli-Palestinian. It is because it is where our money is invested and it will affect us. The MacKay Range Audit was next, which explained that they were in good standing because of all the projects that

they were involved such as Truck Rentals, Tulita Tourism, Cultural Center/Offices for TLC, Tourism Cabins, Tulita Bio-heat project, Solar Panels, and the Norman Wells Reclamation Project. There were questions about the projects and it was answered by Aaron and Andrew Oler, the General Manager of MRDC. These projects helped the people in the community to get jobs, have experience and training, and hopefully help the community in the future towards its economy and people. At the end of the second day, Lorraine Doctor, David Menacho, and Andrew Oler gave their reports over the year and how to improve and get ready for the next year. There were motions to have a new election right away which means that it would be done in the Spring 2024 and a special assembly to announce three new Directors. On a last note, there were a lot of people that attended this year's AGM and even two of the youngest members, Haisley attended briefly in the above photo, and Co-chair Chloe who made sure the agenda was continued and approved, lol.
