The Sahtu Divisional Education Council is seeking three fluent North Slavey/Dene Kede teachers for the position of Indigenous Language Instructor for the school year 2024/25, in the communities of Tulita, Fort Good Hope and Norman Wells.

Candidates must have completed a Teacher Education Program Diploma and/ or Early Childhood Education Diploma and/ or Aboriginal Language and Culture Instructor's Program (ALCIP) Certificate and be eligible for a Northwest Territories teaching certificate.

The following criteria will be important considerations in the hiring process:

- · Fluent North Slavey speaker
- Fluency is representative of one of the Tulita or Fort Good Hope area-specific dialects
- Ability to read and write North Slavey
- Ability to implement Our Languages Curriculum and Program of Study and knowledge of student key competencies and their components
- · Strong working background in culture-based education and on the land programming
- Implementation of locally developed language and culture courses for high school credits
- · Demonstrated knowledge of JK-9 learning practices
- Actively promotes inclusion and student self-regulation
- · A strong commitment to students and community
- Active and positive participation in teacher collaboration, Professional Learning Communities, and ongoing professional growth

Equivalent combinations of education and/or experience will be considered.

Salary: Dependent on verified education and experience, based on the NWTTA Collective Agreement, plus an annual Northern Allowance

On May 19, 2023 the Norman Wells Land Corporation FINAL SELF-GOVERNMENT AGREEMENT FOR THE TŁEGÓHŁĮ GOT'ĮNĘ was completed, and Government of Canada has released the agreement for initial review to the Tulita Land Corporation.

The review is focused to Section 35 rights that may negatively impact the Tulita Land Corporation and its members. Tulita Land Corporation is scheduling a public meeting for Saturday, March 16, 2024 and invites and encourages members to attend. The public meeting will be posted, translation services, door prizes, refreshments and supper will be provided.

The review will cover the proposed Administrative Area and community boundary, jurisdictions and authorities in each area, type of government and areas of jurisdiction, for example "Language, Culture and Spirituality".

This is an important meeting that the Tulita Land Corporation encourages members to come out and learn about the NWLC Self-government.




