Goat

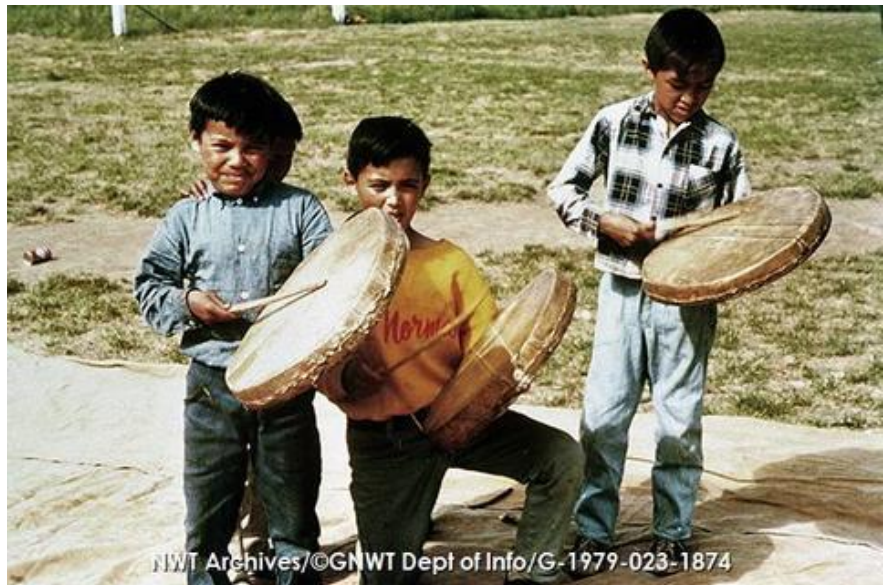

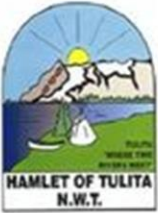

½ Cup Butter

1 Cup Sugar

2 Eggs

Add

2 Cups Flour

1 Tsp Baking Powder

1 Tsp Baking Soda

½ Tsp Salt



Mix in

1 cup Butter Milk

Note: substitute with can cream and 2 tbsp Lemon juice

2 cups Frozen Blueberries

Streusel

¾ Cup Brown Sugar

½ Cup Flour

1 Tsp Cinnamon

¼ cup Butter

Fill Muffin pans ½ way with batter, add streusel and blueberries, then add more batter.

Thai/Coconut Fish Chowder

- 1 Fish of your liking
- 2 cups of chopped onion
- ½ cup of Coconut oil
- 5 strips of Bacon (chopped)
- 4 Tbsp grated of fresh Ginger, Turmeric, garlic
- 4 cups of carrots
- 4 Cups of Potatoes
- 4 cups Chopped of Celery
- 4 cups of Chopped Cabbage
- 2 cups of fresh or frozen corn
- 1 container of Thai Tomato or Thai seasoning
- 1 can of Coconut milk
- Salt and pepper
- Garnish with Fresh Basil and Cilantro.



- A. Sauté fish, bacon, garlic, ginger, turmeric, and onion in the coconut oil,
- B. Add all vegetables and water enough to cover the veggies,
- C. Add the sauté ingredients
- D. Bring to a boil then simmer for about an hour
- E. Best served with Bannock or fried bread.

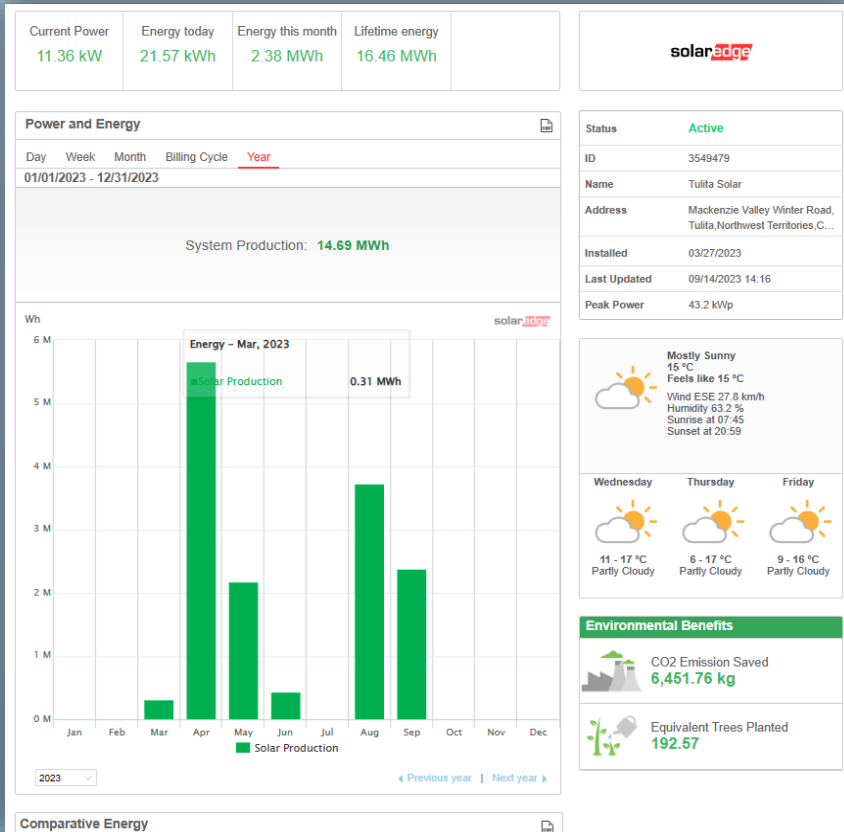

Tulita's Solar project was completed, and power purchase agreement signed with the NWT Power Corporation. The Solar system has so far produced

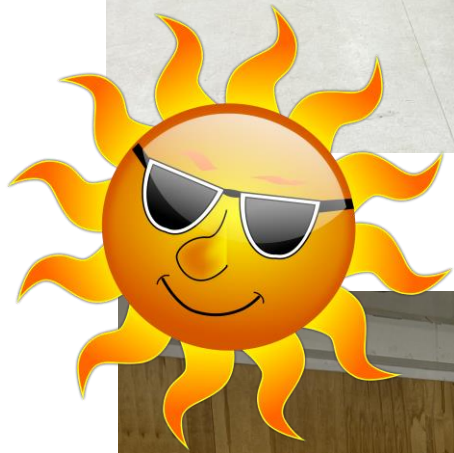

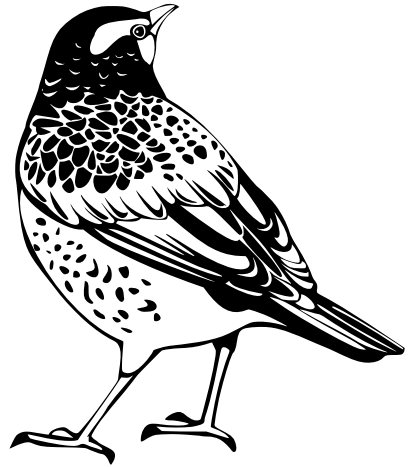
